The technique




- 1. Pour some Hot Chocolate powder into a mug



Paper Snowflakes

Fold a square piece of paper along the diagonal then fold in half once and finally, fold in thirds. Cut the bottom flat and cut interesting shapes along the sides and top. Unfold and see your finished design.



Paper Chains

Cut long strips of different coloured paper. You will need at least 10. Stick the ends of the first strip together with glue or sticky tape. Pass the next strip through the first loop and join the ends. Repeat until you have used all of your strips.




The Big Project

This terms BIG project was a trip to their dream school of the future.




"In the future school will be a nice place with lots of children and no big arguments," says Freya Gatenby.
