crucial for success.



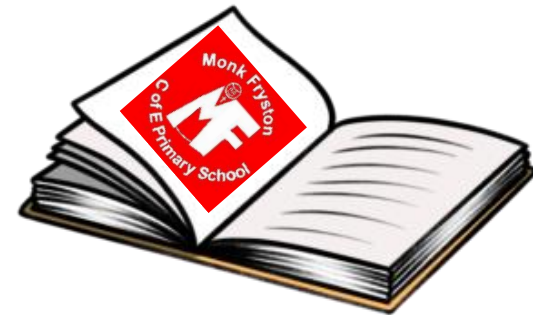

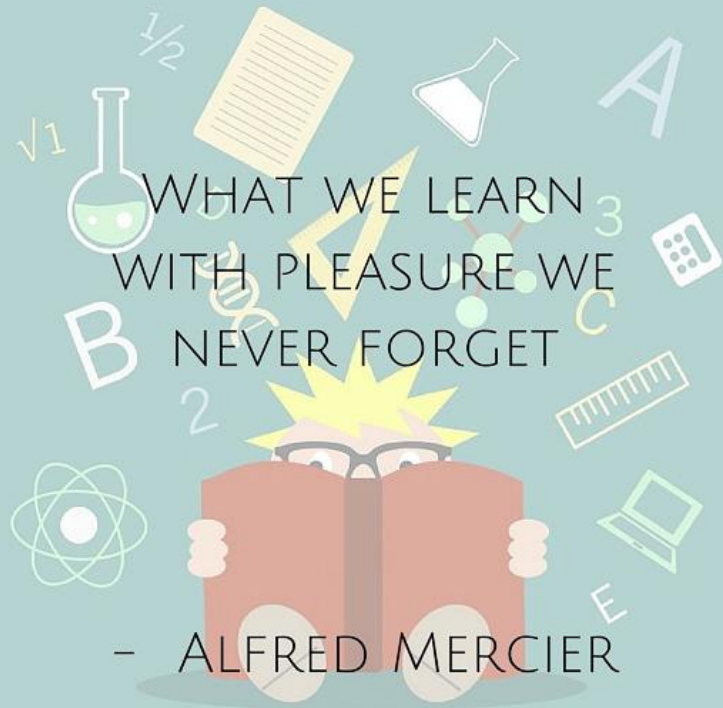

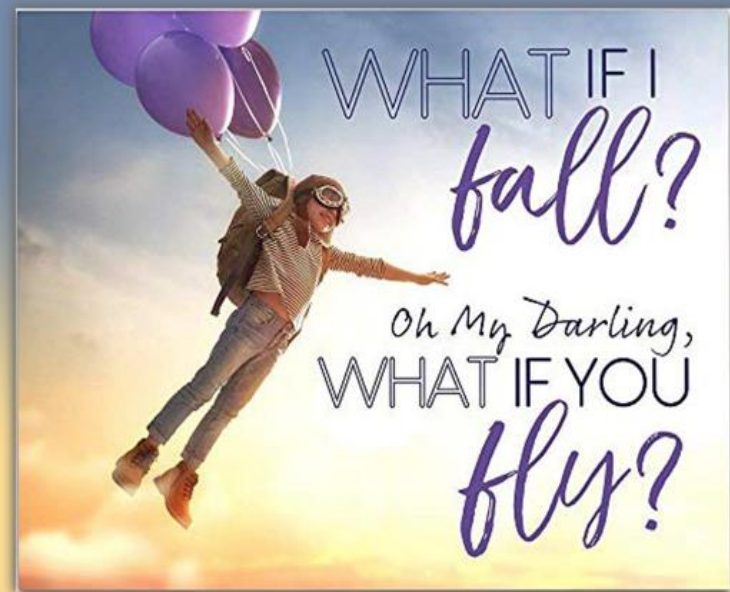
1 Timothy 6:17-18
