It also adds time pressure to activities due to transportation.

It is therefore important that our children are equipped with the necessary skills and understanding to be able contribute to an inclusive society.

We believe that we need to learn how to care for and look after others. We need to understand the core principles of sharing, co-operation and collaboration if we are to be successful, functioning members of our society. If we understand the conventions of good behaviour and exhibit these regularly, we will be successful as individuals on both social and academic levels.
